Workshops for Individuals

January has been very busy with Jeremy running a number of 'One to One' workshops in Bath, Bristol and London. The diversity of subjects requested for workshops is expanding and as a result we will be looking into offering additional courses in specific subjects, for example 'Lighting'. Additionally we are looking at the possibility of running a course in conjunction with a local production company, which would combine camera

work and camera craft skill with subjects such as 'Directing' and 'Producing'.



The great thing about our 'One to One' workshops is that people can specify their date, time and preferred location for the training. We run our workshops very much to fit in with people's work commitments and also as Jeremy is frequently shooting as well, we find this flexibility works for everyone.

Filming Projects

In December, Jeremy concluded a very successful 'Ladette to Lady' shoot for RDF Television which was filmed primarily for the Australian market. Appropriately entitled 'Aussie Ladette to Lady' the show is due to be aired on Australian TV's Channel 9 this year, but hopefully there will be a showing in the UK as well. We will keep you posted when we hear any more news.

Our main news is that at the start of February Jeremy embarks as DoP on a major eight part series for the BBC currently entitled 'To The Ends of The Earth'.

Presenter led, with 9 eager participants and supported by a large production and 4 film crews including Jeremy, they will all be taking part in an expedition across Southern Africa. They will be shooting a number of challenges which include night tracking in the desert, canopy filming in forest and hippo filming underwater.

Each participant will be competing to prove that they have what it takes to become a BBC Natural History Unit cameraman. A myriad of logistics will equal a very exciting and challenging shoot and when Jeremy returns he will be running a series of very informative workshops on how technical and logistic requirements are combined to shoot such a series.
